Job placement rates:

90% of 2015-16 career-related (occupational) graduates reported being employed on the Graduate Follow-Up surveys (February 2016, July 2016, November 2016)

92% of 2015-16 career-related (occupational) associate degree graduates reported being employed

88% of 2015-16 career-related (occupational) certificate graduates reported being employed

How job placement rates are calculated:

Select graduates of career-related (occupational) degrees and certificates who answered the employment status question on the Graduate Follow-Up Survey

$$\text{Number of graduates who reported being employed} / (\text{Total number of graduates responding to employment status question} - \text{Number of graduates who reported they were not employed but they were not looking for employment}) = \text{Job Placement Rate}$$
